To Whom It May Concern:

I've known John Stone for over ten years. I was introduced to him and his wife Sybil Stone through my daughter. It is my understanding that there have been serious allegations made against Mr. Stone. I am surprised by this, because he has always been a kind, generous, and honest man. I would like to give some insight to what I have personally witnessed over the years that has led me to believe that he is a man of good character.

He and his wife have always extended a helping hand to others when they were in need. They have helped raise and taken care of grandchildren and great-grandchildren many times throughout their lives. They always opened their home up to take in and take care of those grandchildren. They worked hard and paid for food, clothes, diapers, formula, medical expenses, school supplies and anything that was needed for those children. I never once saw or heard them tell anyone "No".

They lost everything they owned during hurricane Harvey. The house, their vehicles, and all their personal belongings. They were completely devastated. They had to live in a small RV and were also raising a grandchild that needed care because both his parents were incarcerated. Had they said no to taking in that child he would have been placed in foster care by CPS. They were in their 70's raising great-grandchildren and still doing so even after they lost everything. They never once asked for help or complained about the situation even when it was as bad as it could get for them. John Stone always maintained a positive attitude and outlook on the situation and continued to help others even when he himself needed help. He showed me at that time that he was a resilient and compassionate man.

They had many people take advantage of their kindness and their generosity over the years. I know of a few instances where people they were helping stole from them. They never pressed charges or stopped helping the same people that were clearly there to exploit them. It has been difficult for our family to watch them go through so much. Mr. Stone has always carried himself with dignity and grace even through what seems to be the roughest times of his life. I've never heard a bad word spoken of him until these charges were brought against him. I was shocked and confused by these allegations and thought there is no way this man is capable of what he's being accused of. I do not know all the details of the case, but I can speak to the kind of man Mr. Stone has shown me to be over many years. He has been a man of good character, loved by many, respected by his family, friends, and grandchildren. His grandchildren miss him and his absence from their lives has been difficult for all of them that I can see.

I understand that this is a horrible situation for everyone involved and I empathize with all parties. I would just kindly ask that the court please take my letter into consideration when considering his

sentencing. I truly believe that he is a good man, who means no harm to anyone and has always had the best intentions. Thank you for your time and consideration on this matter.

I fell on hard times when my son was born and lived with Mr. Stone and his wife Sybil for 2 years. John and his wife gave me and my children a place to stay when I was having a hard time in life. They helped me care for my two children. John helped me get back on my feet. I watched him and his wife do this time and time again for others over the years as well. John and his wife would help me with anything I needed. I often saw them go without just so that they could help other people. They never asked for anything in return. I never saw John ever do anything remotely dishonest. He was always soft-spoken and eager to help anyone who he saw struggling. He took care of everyone around him, family or not. Grandkids and great grandkids and even people like me. He was never obligated to help me, but he always did. He could not stand to see anyone suffering. I saw people take advantage of him because of this. I was eventually able to get on my feet and be self-sufficient. They never stopped checking on me and showing up for me over the years. John came to every one of my children's games, school programs, Christmases and birthdays up until these allegations were made. It has been extremely difficult not being able to see him for not only myself but for my children who love him and miss him a great deal. His absence has been hard on everyone who has known him. Due to his health concerns and age, we are afraid that there isn't much time to waste, and we would like him to be part of our lives as long as possible.

I understand how serious this matter is and understand the difficult position everyone is in. It is my sincere hope that the court please takes this letter into consideration at the time of sentencing. Despite the current situation, it is my belief that John Stone is an honorable man. He is a valuable member of his community and not a threat to anyone. I believe him to be a decent human being who deserves the compassion he has always shown to others.

My father has been our foundation through hard times and we have made it through because of his love, strength and faith in the Lord. He raised all 3 of his daughters to be strong, honest and loving women. He has shown us nothing but love , kindness and protection . I feel so blessed to call him my Dad. My father has never harmed us in any way or made me feel uncomfortable. I have 5 grown children including 2 daughters and grandchildren who are very close to him as well . He is well respected and loved by his community of which he served many years in law enforcement with the Jefferson Co Sheriff Department. He served his community with fairness , compassion and pride.He is the most generous person i know and has helped many family, friends and even strangers without thinking twice. He never asks for anything in return . In his 70's he and my mom raised their great grandson for 3 years after the boys parents were incarcerated . He was 4 years old at the time and without them caring for him , he would have been placed in foster care. They made sure he did not miss out on the things that other kids his age were involved in . They helped him with homework and enrolled him in activities like Cub scouts and sports. Part of the time they raised him they had to live in an RV after they lost everything due to hurricane Harvey. I never once heard Dad complain. As a nurse I have seen my fathers health deteriorate over the last several years and recognize that our time left with him is short. As the nurse in the family i have always promised him that i would take care of him at home when that time comes and he needs that 24 hour care. I have been by his side through all his heart surgeries and other recent hospitalizations. After all the kindness and support he has shown his family through the years I have done this without hesitation. I have never thought that I would have to write a character letter for my father . I please ask that the court consider his reputation in the community as an honorable man, and as a loving and caring Husband, Father , brother and friend and allow him to live out the remainder of his life at home with his wife of 60 years and family. He is not a threat to harm anyone and would would comply with all terms of probation.

I am writing this letter on behalf of John Stone. I know him as my, "Uncle Johnny," my mother's brother-in-law, married to my mother's sister, Sybil Stone, and father to my closest cousin, the late Kelly Stone.


My relationship with Uncle Johnnie began at birth. My cousin Kelly, his youngest daughter, was 5 years older than me, and a "sister" from the start. I had no siblings until I was 12 years old, so she was the closest thing that I had to a sibling on my mother's side of the family. My mother, Aunt Sybil, and Uncle Johnny have always had a very close relationship, and as a baby, I was welcome in their home. Kelly loved me like the younger sister she never had, and my earliest memory was of crawling around on the floor of their family home, later at family holidays and get togethers. One of our traditions was for me to come to Aunt Sybil and Uncle Johnny's to spend the night with them and Kelly each Christmas night or vice versa. We were inseparable. As we got older, this tradition continued until Kelly reached high school age. As life throws curveballs, we even sought refuge at times with my aunt, staying for sometimes a week at a time. During this time, I always had a close relationship with my uncle, and know him to be a man supportive to his family, first and foremost, and to his community. During my time with my cousin and staying in their home, he was an example of the perfect uncle. He never displayed anything untoward or questionable towards me. I have background knowledge, both professionally and personally, of child sexual abuse, and if I had any hesitation whatsoever about writing this letter in support of my uncle, his honesty, and his integrity, I would not be doing so. I know the ramifications that accusations like these can have on families and on the communities in which they live. Nothing is more important in my profession than ensuring that a child is safe. I never felt uncomfortable in his presence. I cannot emphasize this enough.

I please ask that the court consider his reputation as an honorable man in the community, and as a family man devoted to the well-being of his children and grandchildren. At this latter point of his life, I ask that you consider allowing him to stay at home where he belongs with his wife and family.

Judge West:

John Wayne Stone was my father's brother.

He was my Godparent when I was baptized as baby into the Roman Catholic church.

I always was close to my Uncle Johnny, especially as a kid. I looked up to him as a hero because he was a police officer with a badge. I later became Baptist but would sometimes attend Mass with his mother when I was there on the weekends at St. Mary's Church in Fannett, Texas. I remember sitting near Uncle Johnny and his family there too. My Uncle loves the Lord and would discuss Biblical prophecy with me when I was a teenager. I asked why he was so interested in these latter day things and explained that he had a car wreck that nearly killed him. He then read the Book of Romans, since he was Roman Catholic, and had a born again experience. I know that he prays on a regular basis. He has prayed for me often. I later got interested in helping my Jewish friends find Jesus/Yeshua as Messiah. I got involved in Messianic Judaism while attending Lamar University and am now the Rabbi of Congregation Melech Yisrael here in Beaumont. Our ancestors were founding settlers of Jefferson County during the Republic of Texas era, and came here before 1825 while it was still Mexico. So Uncle Johnny is a sixth generation Texan. I believe he is a good man that loves his family. He had 3 daughters. Stephanie, Nancy and Kelly are my first cousins. Sadly Kelly passed away. Please show a bit of mercy on my aging Uncle because of a lifetime of service to this city of Beaumont. He did plead guilty but I still believe that he is not. I see no pattern of harm to my three cousins. Maybe house arrest would also prevent him from danger in prison because of his history as a police officer. Thank you for reading this letter.

I will first introduce myself and state my relationship to Mr. Stone. My name is Michelle Mott Tillery. I currently reside in Beaumont Texas but grew up in Fannett. I am close friends with Mr. Stone's two surviving daughters. I am 55 years old and I've known the family since I was 3 years old. The Stone family is exactly that to me, family.

The man that I know as "Johnny" is what I would call, "one of the last of a dying breed of gentleman". Together, Mr. Stone and his wife, Sybil raised 3 strong and beautiful ladies, losing one daughter to cancer. Their role in their children's lives didn't end there. They have also gone way beyond "helping" out with their grandchildren as well. They together have spent their precious time and hard earned money to help their children and grandchildren

with WHATEVER the need may have been. To see the end result of their immense kindness and love is heartbreaking to me.

Being asked to write this letter brought back so many memories of being at the Stone's home on many occasions. His daughter, Nancy and I were inseparable for the most part. During our grade school years, we lived right next door to each other. I even broke my collarbone on their refrigerator due to "running in the house".

I always felt sorry for Johnny because he was the "lone man" in the house surrounded by cackling hens, lol.

I NEVER felt "uneasy" around Johnny at all. He never tried to impose himself in any of our conversations or try to converse with me in any inappropriate way for the entire time I've known him. His daughters were all happy and NEVER let on that they were uncomfortable in any way. Today, Johnny is facing devastation in a time that should be spent with those dear to him. His health is failing him as well. This man is not a threat to anyone and is following all rules that he supposed to. I ask you to consider the fact that people who know him support him and his character so strongly.

My prayers are that Johnny Stone not spend any time in incarceration so that he can tend to his medical issues and be with his family that loves him so much.

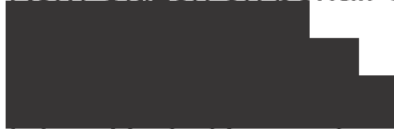

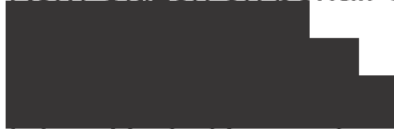
